




Kenora Nordic Trails

DESCRIPTION The Kenora Nordic Trails is a series of wilderness trails which are well signed. The trails intimately wind through mixed forest and rocky ridges. May experience wet conditions in the wet season. Groomed cross-country ski trails in the winter season.



Rabbit Lake Trail, **Jaffray Melick**

DESCRIPTION The Rabbit Lake Trail system is partially inclusive, accessible and paved. This trail starts at the end of Nairn Avenue and this portion is called the Rotary Way Trail. This portion of the trail joins into the main Rabbit Lake Trail at a spectacular viewing site overlooking Rabbit Lake. Your journey continues along the shore of Rabbit Lake to Garrow Park and Beach. To complete your journey the trail then follows Birchwood Crescent, onto to Valley Drive which leads you back to Nairn Avenue. There are several resting areas along the bush portion of the trail.
